This is an application announcement for student mobility for studies carried out by Eskişehir Technical University and North American Private University under the scope of Erasmus+ Program. KA171 ICM projects, which enable student mobility with countries around the world other than the member countries of the European Union, are mobility projects carried out on a department or faculty basis, projected every year, and also known as "International Credit Mobility."

1. DEFINITIONS

-Student Mobility for Studies; For one semester, students enrolled in a formal higher education program study at the partner university. The host institution recognizes the courses that the student accomplishes during the semester at the partner institution.

- The duration of the activity for student mobility for studies is one semester (Approximately 5 months) excluding travel days.

2. QUOTAS and DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

Only 1 incoming student from the Department of Computer Science will be granted under the scope of this project for the fall semester, which approximately starts in September 2026 till February 2027.

3. APPLICATIONS

Applications will be made with the submission of the required documents to the International Relations Unit of North American Private University.

- To get a score from the evaluation criteria (if any suitable), the document for the relevant criteria must be submitted

These documents must be submitted before the deadline of the application. Any submission after the deadline will be rejected.

3. EVALUATION AND SELECTION

Since the KA171 program is carried out on a departmental basis, only the relevant department bachelor/masters/PhD level students can apply for the specified quotas. Selection and placement among the applicants will be based on the total success score which is calculated out of 100 as follows: %50 of GPA + %50 of Foreign Language Score. Students placed within the quotas will be supported with grants (individual support + travel support).

Evaluation Criteria

3. 1. GPA (%50) Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 14/20, equivalent to 70/100.

3.2 Foreign Language Score (50%)

Applicants must demonstrate a minimum English language proficiency level of B2 according to the CEFR. Accepted proof of language proficiency includes:

- A valid internationally recognized English language certificate; or
- An official certificate issued by North American Private University confirming the student's CEFR level.

Language scores will be converted as follows:

- B2 = 90 points
- C1 or above = 100 points

3. 2. For students with disabilities (provided that the disability is documented) +10 additional points will be applied.

3. 3. For students who have previously benefited from the study or internship mobility within the scope of Erasmus+ with or without grant within the same education level, -10 points will be applied for each previously benefited activity.

3.4 In case of participating in mobility in the country of citizenship, -10 points are applied (should be documented by the student institution)

3.5 Students with documented participation in extracurricular activities, student clubs, volunteering initiatives, competitions, leadership activities, or community engagement projects will receive an additional 10 points.

3.6 Students must provide a motivation letter (maximum one page) explaining their academic and personal objectives for participating in the Erasmus+ mobility programme. The motivation letter is a mandatory application document and does not contribute to the final score.

- Based on the student's overall score, reductions are made.

- If the total points are equal, the student with the higher GPA will be given priority; if the GPA is equal, the student with the younger age will be given priority.

4. GRANT SUPPORT

The participant will receive a **monthly grant of €800 for 4 months**. In addition, they will receive €309 for travel support, or €417 if the student prefers green travel.

The travel expenses to be paid to the student benefiting from the mobility activity should be calculated using the "Distance Calculator." The distance calculator can be accessed from the link below:

Green Travel

The Erasmus+ Green Travel Grant is a form of support aimed at encouraging environmentally friendly travel methods. This grant is provided to Erasmus+ participants who choose sustainable means of transportation, such as buses, trains, bicycles, or car-sharing, to reduce their carbon footprint during their travels. Students opting for green travel receive additional financial support to cover their travel expenses, and they are often granted an extra day of individual support (per diem).

This grant is part of the Erasmus+ program's commitment to sustainability and aims to raise awareness about environmental responsibility.

Additional Grant Support

Within the scope of KA171 incoming student mobility, only participants with disabilities will be eligible to receive Additional Grant Support in the amounts specified in the table below, in addition to the grant they are entitled to. To determine whether the participant qualifies as a person with a disability, higher education institutions must request official documentation (such as a disability card, medical report, etc.) in accordance with their national legislation.

Students who meet these conditions and are within this scope will receive an additional grant support of 250 Euros in addition to their scholarships.

Residence Permit and Other Expenses

Apart from the grant and travel support provided within the scope of the program, no additional payment will be made to the student. The student is responsible for covering their own travel expenses, accommodation costs, and any expenses arising from official documents such as the residence permit.
